

MANAGERS REPORT FOR 1/20/09

This has been a busy month with a lot of maintenance repair work on old pump stations and plugged sewer lines. The worst of these were the continual unplugging station 9 at johnsons landing R V dump , A two man crew had to pull and unplug the pump eight times new years weekend .Each of these callouts require two men minimum and it is on overtime. A callout is two hours minimum per man. Union agreement,

Very good news, Our new sewer plant is completely in service and working very well and new pump stations 22 & 24 are complete and in service on line. They are first class stations where any malfunction or tampering send an alarm signal to the field superintendent , myself and the on call cell phone.

Burrtec Waste Industries is holding a staff meeting on the 27th of this month to finalize their version of the contract with this District to supply treated sewer water to their dump site, (the old county dump)

I will ask the Board of Directors to have a study session very soon to make some modifications to the Sewer Ordinance to require all R V dump stations have minimum 2 H P grinder pump installed in them and discharge thru a flow meter. This will eliminate most sewer line obstructions and the dump station operator will pay a discharge fee to offset District high maintenance cost which drains our maintenance fund.
